## CHAMBER BENEFIT OF THE MONTH

This month, I thought I'd focus on some of the lesser known benefits, utilized by different sectors of our membership.

**CERTIFICATES OF ORIGIN** — If you're asking yourself "what's a certificate of origin?" then you probably aren't an industrial member who ships to foreign markets. Chambers of Commerce have traditionally issued certificates of origin on behalf of U.S. exporters who are required to provide assurances to foreign buyers that the goods they are purchasing originated in the United States.

When the Chamber of Commerce receives a request for a certificate of origin, the manufacturer of the goods must provide us with the invoices, shipper's affidavits and other documents which may indicate the product origin. The Chamber, upon inspection of the documents, may then affix its signature and seal to state that to the best of our knowledge the products were indeed of U.S. origin. There is no fee for this service, but we do ask that you telephone before arriving so the person who may affix the seal is on site.

**TELEPHONE DIRECTORIES, COUNTY MAPS AND RECRUITMENT PACKAGES** — The Chamber keeps a large supply of telephone directories for our members' convenience. Several of you have many phones in multiple offices, and we are happy to supply those extra copies to you and your employees. Many of the sales representatives come to the office to refresh their supply and to pick up a current map of the county.

Both the directories and the maps are provided free-of-charge to your Chamber, and we are happy to provide those resources. The maps are provided courtesy of the Wabash County Convention and Visitor's Bureau, and are utilized extensively in relocation and recruitment packets. The maps provide street detail for the City of Wabash, and the towns of North Manchester, Roann, Lagro, and LaFontaine.

So, remember, if you have visitors coming to Wabash, or you are recruiting for your company, we are happy to provide relocation packets with demographics, attractions, maps and other information for your prospects. Just give us a call and we'll get them ready for you.

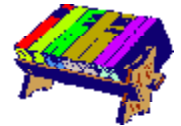

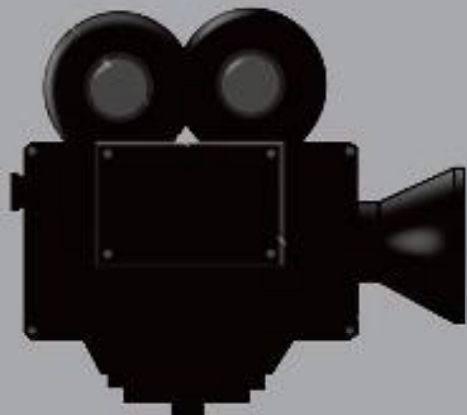
