The two-ounce energy shot was introduced in 2004 and is now distributed world-wide. 5-Hour Energy gives you a blend of amino acids, B-vitamins and essential nutrients with zero sugar and only four calories. First round of sales testing was conducted at a health store chain then moved to traditional retailers. Since these little energy shots did not compete for, nor need refrigerator space, stores such as The Home Depot, Dick's Sporting Goods, and Village Pantry could set their product on the counter tops. Similar retailers have helped boost 5-Hour Energy to a best-seller worth more than \$300 million, last year.

Living Essentials employs more than 130 full-time employees and has plans for a 400,000 square foot building expansion, the addition of 6 new bottling lines, and the possibility of adding just under 100 new jobs. In its efforts to truly recognize the contributions of the agriculture sector to our economy and way of life in Wabash County, the Committee has created a **Wabash County Farm Family of the Year Award**. Based upon their farm practices and community involvement, one Wabash County family will be selected for this honor in October of each year.
